Overview

The Yadkin River State Trail blueway is 163 miles long, beginning at the Kerr Scott Dam in Wilkes County and extending all the way to the confluence with the Uwharrie River in Montgomery County. Mile 0 begins at the confluence with the Uwharrie River, and river mileage points increase up to mile 163 at the Kerr Scott Dam.

There are four large dams to portage around along the southern part of the trail at High Rock Lake, Tuckertown Lake, Badin Lake, and Falls Reservoir. There are smaller dams further upstream to portage around at Idol's Dam (south of Tanglewood in Forsyth County) and just north of the Old 421 River Park access.
